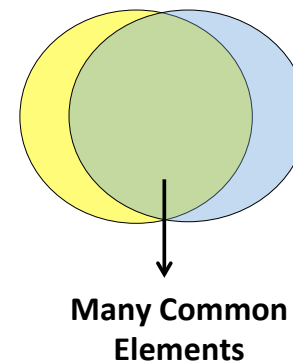

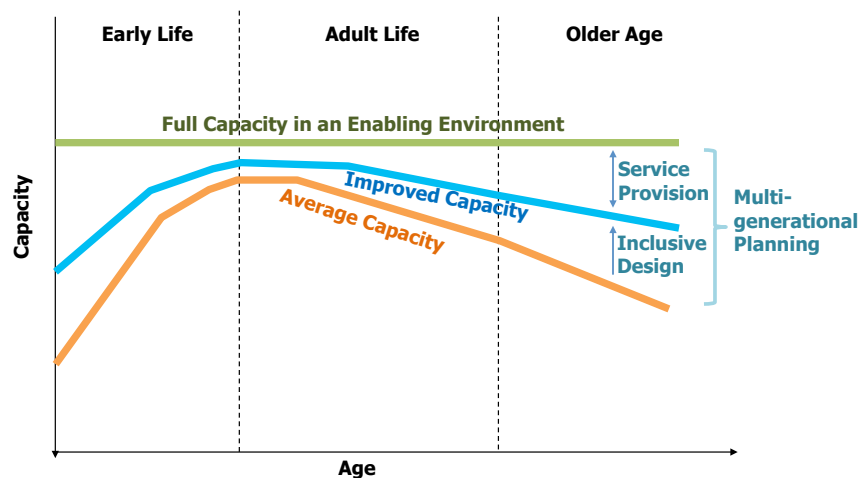

The link between design and services



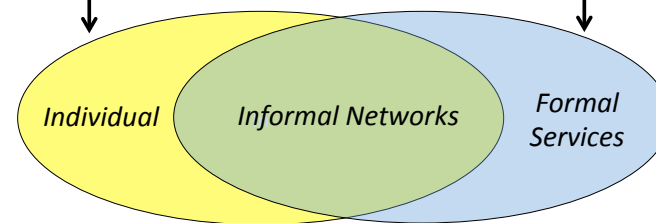
